

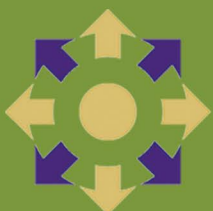

The Applied Learning Route

Harley Reed has developed an applied learning route in collaboration with CILT to afford practicing professionals with an alternative route to qualifications and chartered membership. The traditional route of examinations is also available to individuals. For those working, the applied learning route provides a robust way to demonstrate competence through assignments done at work (and a project at advanced level).

How the programme is delivered?

The programme is delivered through a series of intensive 2-day workshops. The Diploma level comprises 4 modules. Irrespective of the pathway chosen, all individuals will complete the same core module and one of 3 electives before embarking on their specific pathway. After each module, individuals will have a period of time to submit their assignments, under guidance of a tutor. The Advanced Diploma level comprises 5 units, four of which are assessed as per the Diploma level, but the final module is assessed via a 6 months professional project and presentation.

What specialist pathways are available?

There are a range of pathways - Individuals can therefore choose from Procurement, Transport, Inventory & Warehousing, and Production pathways. For corporates choosing in-house programmes there are additional pathways such as retail logistics, port operations, etc which can be chosen.

What is the entry point?

Most individuals will enter at the Diploma level. On completion of the Diploma programme, individuals can progress to the Advanced Programme. More experienced individuals may be eligible to start directly at the Advanced Diploma level, which comprises 4 modules and a professional project and presentation. On completion of the programme, individuals will achieve the internationally recognised Advanced Diploma and will also usually be eligible for CILT Chartered Membership (CMILT).

Duration

Diploma: 6 months.

Advanced Diploma: 12-15 months.
